# Help Council Build a Better Corryong

---

Corryong residents are being urged to support Towong Shire Council's bid for a share in the Federal Government's \$297.7 million Building Better Regions Fund.

Council is currently preparing to submit a funding application seeking funding to improve infrastructure and support development in Corryong.

Initial plans include developing a walking track along Cemetery Creek from Strezlecki Way to Memorial Avenue connecting Corryong's key facilities and attractions. Meanwhile, new way-finding signage would support tourism by offering directions to Corryong's key facilities and attractions.

Towong Shire Council Mayor Cr David Wortmann said the fund aims to create jobs, drive economic growth and build stronger regional communities.

"Council sees this as an opportunity to enhance the look and feel of the Corryong township and create a better connected and more accessible community," he said. "We also hope to receive enough funding to beautify township entrances, repair the median, kerb and channel along Hanson Street, and increase trees and garden beds throughout the town."

"Funding applications are more likely to be successful if there is evidence of community support. To maximise the prospects of a successful application, we are asking businesses and other organisations to consider making contributions to this project."

Contributions could include:

- a donation towards street furniture
- money for landscaping along our walking tracks or
- a contribution to way-finding signage that directs the visitors to local attractions
